All Students across the academy have now had access to the Start program and have set up their online profile. All new starters to the Academy will have the opportunity to set up a profile within their first few months are joining us. This platform will provide our students with real world information about jobs that would suit them, it will also allow them to explore pathway options form as early as year 8 and will also allow them to build a record of all the careers and development work they have done whilst at Harmonize Academy. This will help student be better prepared for the world upon leaving the Academy in Year 11.




For over 15 years Teach First have been we've been helping schools build a fair education for all. 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Lower Academy Provision

Students in year 9 will be introduced to the Start profile, which is an online system designed to provided up to date information relating to careers and further education information. The site allows students to access key information related to their future and will help them make decisions about their choices during their time at Harmonize Academy.

During the lower academy programme students will have the opportunity to be involved in careers events, trip and competitions that we believe will aid their careers development and help them grown in confidence.

Students will also access specific lessons that focus on CEIAG as part of the PHSE programme where teachers will discuss vital information related to careers and further education programmes.

Upper Academy Provision

During year 10-11 students will have wide range of opportunities to develop their careers goals and ambitions.

All of the events we offer at Harmonize Academy are designed to suit the needs of all upper Academy learners. All students across the upper Academy will continue to manage their online start profile adding key information and narrowing their search for future pathways. They will go deeper into the software researching labour market information helping them make clear and informed decisions about their future.

Year 10 will also attend the Careers day and mock interview conference allowing them to ask pertinent questions to relevant providers regarding their future. This will allow them to make more informed decisions regarding their future options. Students in year 10 & 11 will be introduced to the Start profile, which is an online system designed to provided up to date information relating to careers and further education information. The site allows students to access key information related to their future and will help them make decisions about their choices during their time at Harmonize Academy.

Year 10 will also have the opportunity to complete a two day college placement at a local college. This secondary college experience is designed to open the eyes of students and get a real taste of college life. They will select options and attend college as if they were a college student. This allows our students to experience college first hand and will allow to experience lessons and procedures related to college life.

In the summer term some year 10 students will complete a one week work experience programme. This programme will give the students the opportunity to experience the world of work. Our students self place meaning they are responsible for sourcing employment, making the necessary applications and attending their week of work. They are supported by Academy staff in writing letters, writing CV's and completing applications as necessary. We believe this approach allows students to become much more independent and this in turn will prepare them better for the world after Harmonize Academy. Year 11 becomes much more focused with each student attending personal interviews with a careers advisor. The advisor will discuss post 16 options in detail and work with the students to aid them in making post 16 decisions. Action plans are formulated so that students have clear goals and these can be discussed with mentors, form tutors and parents. Our aim is to support year 11 students in the application processes for college, sixth form, apprenticeships or employment to ensure that when they leave Harmonize they are prepared and engaged for their next steps.


Mock Interview Conference 5/3/24

START Profile Introduction



At Harmonize Academy all our students will have access to the Start programme and should have already set up a profile. The new cohort that join us in September will have the opportunity to join the software in the first term.

Over the course of the year we will be using the Start programme more and more to enhance form time activities, PHSE lessons and even classroom based lessons.

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

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Once a student finds an interesting job they can access further information simply by clicking the job/career. The programme will then give up to date labour market information on that career including **qualifications and routes in**, salary information and even live links to real world jobs and apprenticeships.

Here is an example of the Home page/profile page. Here students can **add interests, skills qualities, preferences and choices** and from the data provided the software will provide our students with a range of suggested jobs.





An important feature of the Start programme is the LOCKER. This is a place where students can add evidence for the careers based activities they have completed over their time at Shavington Academy. This is something similar to the old records of achievement but will allow students to collate evidence ready for important applications for post 16 pathways.
