To recognise and celebrate progress and dedication, the department awards certificates each term to the "HA Photographer of the Term"—acknowledging hard work both in and outside the classroom.

Facilities

- State-of-the-art ICT suites equipped with the latest photography and editing software
- Top-of-the-range photography equipment including cameras, lighting and editing tools
- Open-plan, modern classrooms with interactive whiteboards and collaborative workspaces

Component 1: Portfolio (60%)

This is a coursework-based unit where students build a portfolio of work showing their ideas development, technical skill, and creativity. Themes may include:

- Disguise
- Identity
- Landmarks
- Religion
- Environments
- Portraits
- Still Life

.

Students are encouraged to explore different genres and techniques to produce personal and meaningful responses.

Component 2: Externally Set Assignment (40%)

Students select from starting points provided by AQA and independently develop a creative response. This includes a 10-hour practical exam to produce a final outcome.

This component assesses the student's ability to:

- Develop and refine ideas
- Research and reference other artists/photographers
- Experiment with media, techniques, and processes
- Realise a final outcome that meets all four AQA assessment objectives

Skills Students Will Develop

- Contextual understanding: exploring historical, cultural, and social influences in photography
- Technical skills, including:
 - o Lighting
 - Viewpoint
 - o Aperture and depth of field
 - o Shutter speed and movement
 - o Use of digital and darkroom processes

• Media and materials:

- o Film and photographic paper
- o Darkroom chemicals
- o Digital programs and editing software
- o Graphic media for planning and storyboarding
